What is it? A little jar of dried seaweed flakes. They look like scrapings of old green

from a weathered wall.

Yum! Well, if you can get past the looks, they are actually delicious: an umami-rich "flavour booster" to sprinkle on other things such as pasta dishes, eggs, smashed avo or potato wedges. Alg even suggests sprinkling them on muesli.

Why? Because "seaweed isn't just for sushi", says the company's founder, a dietitian and wellness type from Melbourne.

What exactly is wakame? A species of kelp native to the Pacific northwest; it's a staple in Japanese cuisine, and rich in iodine. Alg has it handharvested in Tasmanian waters, and freeze-dries it for extra crunch.

What to say: "Oooh, you can really taste the sea."

Don't say: "Alg? Isn't that the sound of someone gagging?"

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
